She'll also be monitoring Piping Plovers, overseeing the pack-in, pack-out garbage initiative and educating visitors about why they should keep their dogs on leash!

DUNE STABILIZATION AND RESTORATION

In early spring, the Carters Beach dunes underwent some marram grass planting. Marram grass encourages dune growth by trapping and stabilizing blown sand and reducing wind speeds across the surface of the dune.

PACK-IN & PACK-OUT

This summer at Carters Beach we'll be piloting a pack in, pack out approach to garbage.

In the coming weeks the **garbage can at the parking lot will be removed** and we'll be promoting and encouraging visitors to leave no trace- take only pictures, and leave only footprints.

WHAT WE'RE STILL WORKING ON!

Parking: We've been in communication with the RCMP and the Department of Transportation and have noted that illegal parking can carry fines of up to \$250. We plan to communicate this with beach visitors through Kaitlyn & our social media account.

Outhouses: For Summer 2018 there will be 2 port-a-potties at the parking lot. We're still working on other options for 2019.

Carrying Capacity Research: We want decisions about managing Carters Beach to be science-informed and are working on research that will tell us how many people the beach can support both from an ecological & social standpoint.
